Organized in 1973, the Senior Organization began meeting as the Senior Club in Faith Lutheran Church in Woodland Park. In 1977 the city donated an old, abandoned building that at one time was a feed store and home to VFW. Using money from a federal grant and private donations, the building was renovated, and the Organization took occupancy in 1978. Various additions and renovations have been made in the following years to give us what we have today – the Woodland Park Senior Center – home for the Woodland Park Senior Organization.
